

When Websites Go Down

Today there is a major issue with many Web services and Internet sites not working properly or failing to load completely. The problem is being caused by a Distributed Denial of Service attack (DDoS) against a company called Dyn who is the Domain Name Service (DNS) provider for many sites and services. Without being too technical, DNS is what turns a site name like google.com into the corresponding IP address (216.58.192.206) and allows your computer to connect to the web server located at that address. The DDoS attacks are flooding these servers with many, many junk requests as a way of disrupting access to any site or service that relies on Dyn's network infrastructure.

The best thing to do while they are resolving the problem is to sit tight and try back later, but what we can take away from an outage like this is that cyber attacks are getting larger in scale and more prevalent than they've ever been. The best practice when protecting your devices, data or connectivity is to have backups, think about security and plan for redundancy. Whether it's a loss of connection, loss of data or an infected computer, dealing with today's cyber threats can be time consuming and costly. Tech Tip: Laptops Have Shorter Lifespans

Drops, spills, screen cracks, dead hard drives, overheating, plastic cracks, and broken keys - thus is the life of a laptop. We see many people going to the laptop as a default even when buying a cheap computer for the kids or just for email and Internet browsing. If you don't need the portability of a laptop, the best option out there for lifespan and total cost of ownership is still the trusty desktop.
